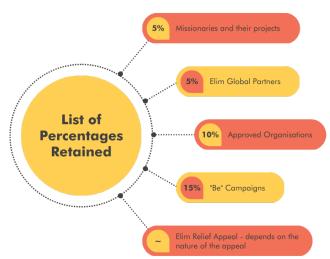
How We Use The Percentage We Retain

Elim Missions is a self-funded department of the Elim Foursquare Gospel Alliance and we rely on donations and the percentage we retain from those donations. As a department we also receive: Gift Aid rebates*, legacy or inheritance gifts, one-off undesignated gifts, gifts from EFGA, and monies raised by our team's Fundraisers.

The percentages we retain are used as follows:

- Missions office operational costs,
- Processing of finances to missionaries and partners**
- Compliance with Charity Commission regulations,
- Support missionaries with administration, training and Member Care.
- Support missionaries in the promotion of their ministries & projects.
- Support missionaries who need immediate/urgent financial support.

^{**}For mobile/digital giving the percentage taken by Stripe is included in, not an addition to, the percentage retained by Elim Missions. The net percentages retained from giving are as defined in the above graphic.



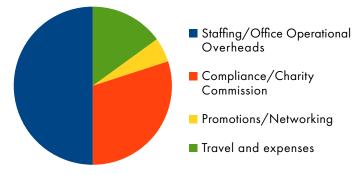
The percentage retained from an Elim Relief Appeal is assessed and agreed by the International Missions Director, the General Superintendent, the Finance Officer, Office Manager, Senior Missions Assistant and Elim HQ Finance Manager. It is based on a number of factors, including the nature of the disaster/crisis, the location and the amount of work required by the Elim Missions office to run the appeal.

How we use the 5% retained on giving to Missionaries:



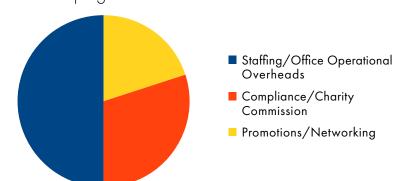
How we use the 5% retained on giving to Elim Global Partners:
